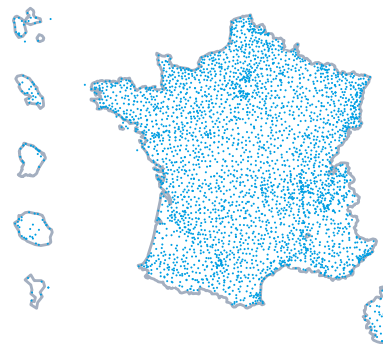

# 1 - THE GENDARMERIE, THE MILITARY-STATUS FORCE COVERING THE NATIONAL TERRITORY





## THE "BRIGADE," THE UNITS ROOTED IN THE TERRITORY

- Creation of **239** new territorial units in the framework of the LOPMI Act
- **750,000** downloads of the MaSécurité application

The territorial unit, attached to the barracks, is the foundation and means of action of the Gendarmerie. It is the versatile building block on which the entire institution is based. It is a 'support' and 'forward base' that guarantees coverage of the national territory, from which all missions can be carried out (public security, criminal investigation, intelligence gathering, etc.).



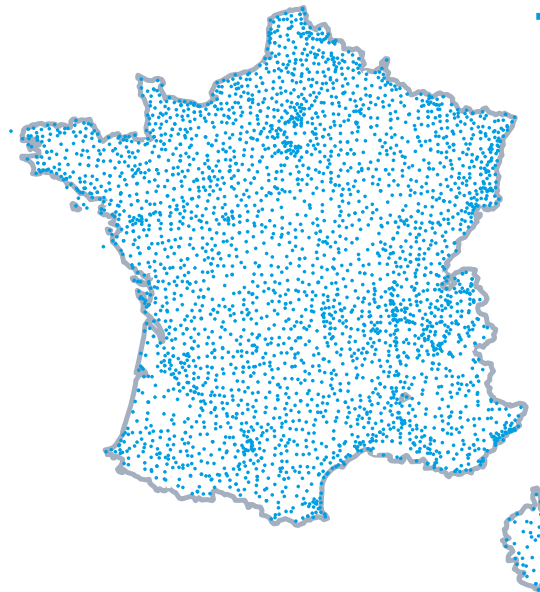

It accounts for two-thirds of population growth since 2007. One-third of inhabitants in the Gendarmerie's AoR live in urban areas.

## THE TERRITORIAL COVERAGE

Present across 95% of the country, the Gendarmerie relies on a network of 3,100 units, attached to their barracks. These versatile «support» points and «forward operating bases» guarantee the presence of the State at the heart of the territories, even in remote areas or those affected by rural exodus. This dense network enables local actions tailored to local risks and threats and embodies the specificity of the model: gendarmes have to live where they serve and serve where they live.

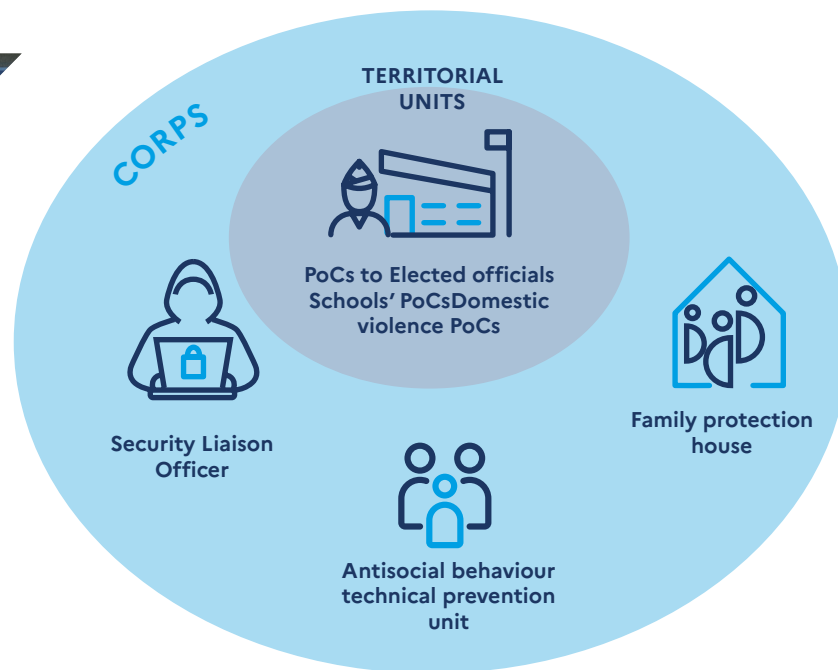

## OPERATIONAL DEFENCE OF THE TERRITORY (DOT)

Thanks to its military status, the Gendarmerie contributes to the implementation of the DOT in **four areas** :

- intelligence of military interest
- defence of critical infrastructure
- support for the build-up and mobility of military forces on national territory
- participation in combat operations.

- Current capabilities : **30,000** active gendarmes and between **36,000** and **50,000** operational reservists.

Capabilities ramped up to strengthen territorial protection against hybrid threats in an unstable geopolitical context through :

- the acquisition of new equipment;
- the consolidation of military doctrine;
- the stepping-up of training;
- increased interoperability with the armed forces and other ministries..

Taking emerging threats into account : anti-drone measures, combating cyber threats, etc.



## MOBILE GENDARMERIE SQUADRONS

The MGSs are characterised by the robustness, resilience, versatility and the proportionate use of force of their personnel, who can be deployed at any time and to any place..








Historical missions: maintaining and restoring public order in urban and rural areas, in mainland France and overseas..

## MISSIONS TO TACKLE ROAD SAFETY ISSUES

Based on an analysis of movements, road safety missions are part of the strategy and objectives defined locally by the commander of the divisional Gendarmerie corps.

The methods of action are based on :

- a specific time-and-place framework;
- the ethics and exemplary behaviour of gendarmes;
- operational and educational prevention;
- highway code enforcement (in uniform or plainclothes).

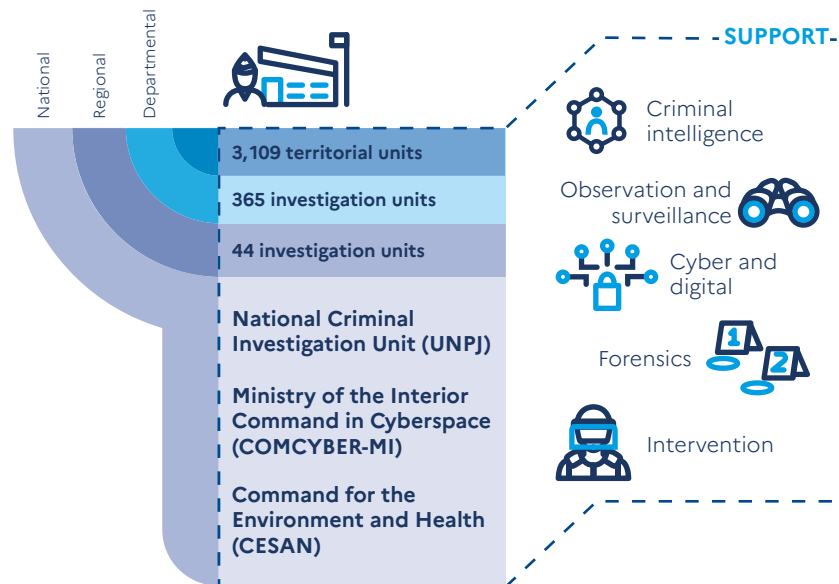

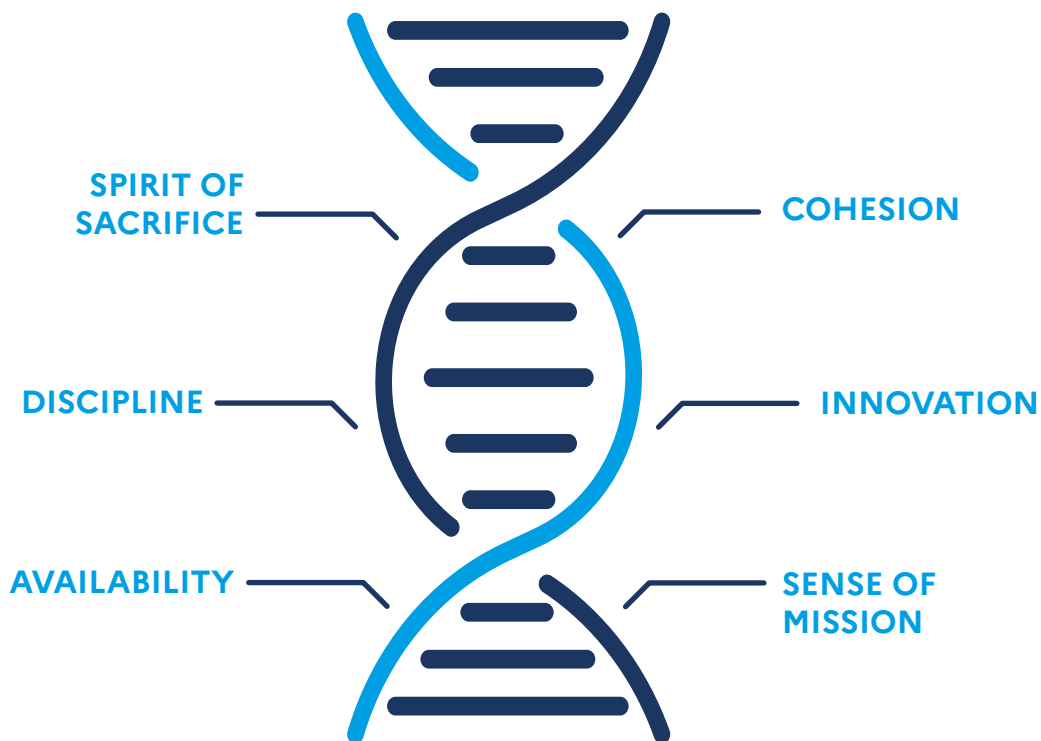

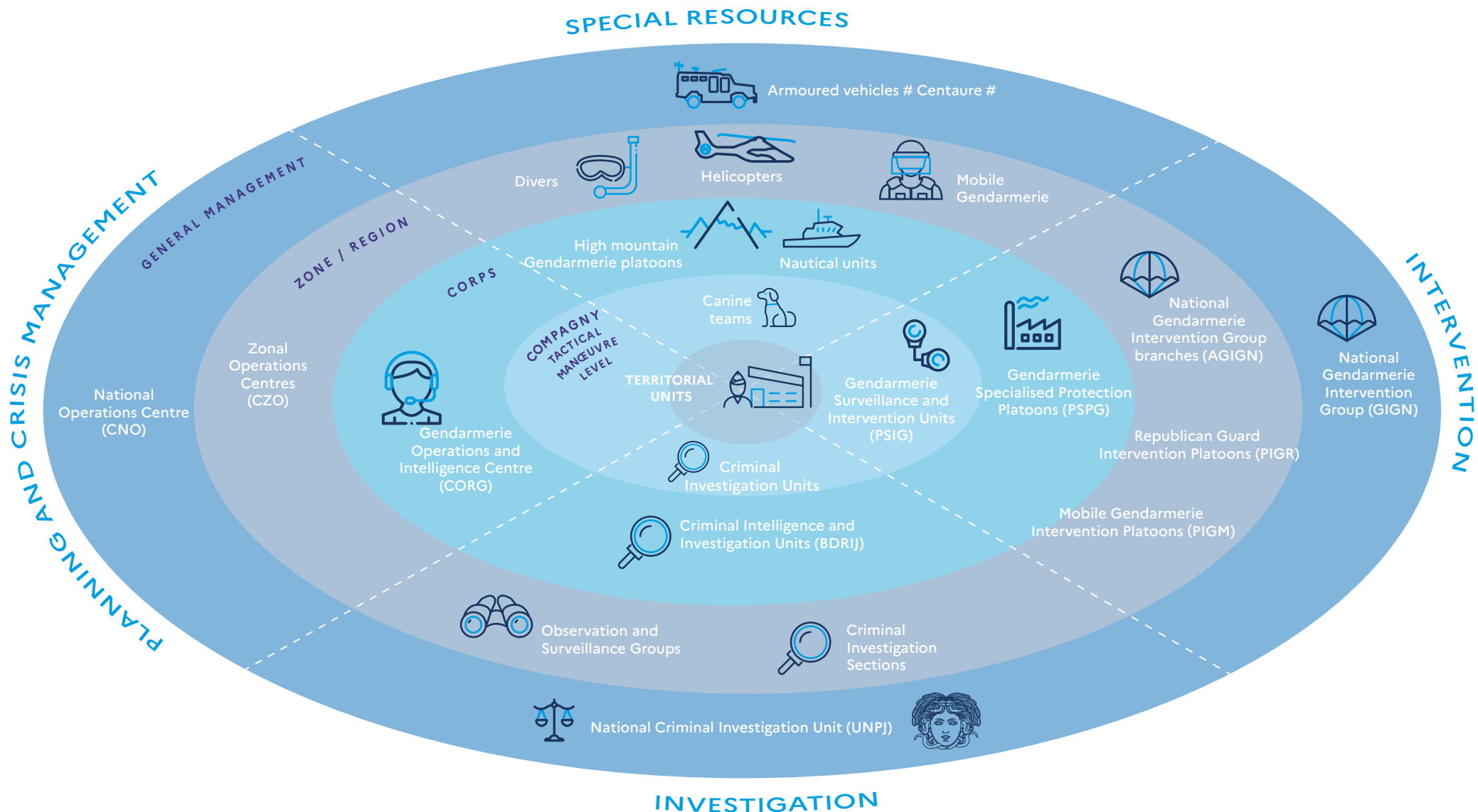

# 3 - THE CHALLENGES FACING THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE



## SPECIFIC MISSIONS

General public security, local policing, crowd and riot control, combating organised crime, particularly international trafficking, combating armed factions and illegal gold mining in French Guiana, national sovereignty and defence of fundamental interests (overseas exclusive economic zones represent more than 90% of the French EEZ); regional security cooperation. 3,956 divisional gendarmes, 2,700 mobile gendarmes deployed, representing 39 mobile Gendarmerie squadrons (baseline of 21 squadrons in non-crisis situations), plus 1,400 operational reservists.

State presence even in the most remote territories

**10** overseas territories covering an area of **120,370 KM<sup>2</sup>** with **2.8 MILLION** inhabitants.

The Gendarmerie covers **99%** of these territories and protects **70%** of their population.

**1,263 KM** of land borders, with Brazil and Suriname in French Guiana, and with the Netherlands in Saint-Martin.

In terms of crime, overseas territories — which represent 5.5% of the French population — account for 20% of violent crimes. Overseas territories account for 27% of gendarmes injured in 2024 and 60% of gendarmes injured as a result of an assault with a weapon.

- French presidency of the FIEP from October 2024 to October 2025.

- The European Gendarmerie Force (EGF) was created in 2004 on France's initiative.
- It comprises: 7 member countries (France, Italy, Spain, Portugal, the Netherlands, Romania and Poland), 1 partner country and 3 observer countries.
- As a tool for managing external crises, the EGF intervenes in crisis areas under the aegis of international organisations (EU, UN, NATO) in order to restore order and uphold security, particularly in weakened states.
- Strategy for 2025-2029: strengthening its visibility and rapid deployment capabilities.

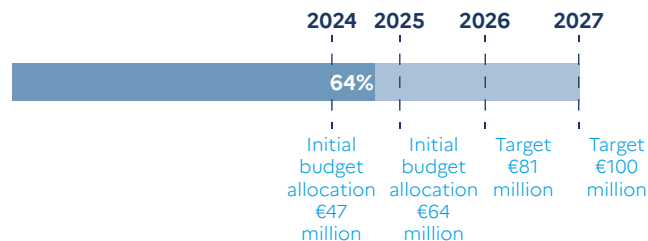

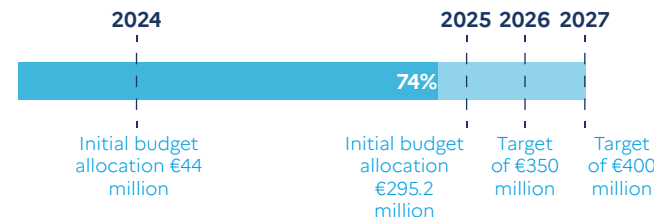
